Bill Purcell II reported on the meeting of the Executive Committee that studied the needs of the church for a Director of Christian Education. Dr. Carter has spoken with Ms. McCall and Mr. Julian Butler, Chairman of the Board of Trustees of Monroe Camp and Retreat Center and both are in agreement.
