

# CALL TO WORSHIP AND ENTRANCE OF THE ELEMENTS The Light of Christ

# All: Jesus Christ is the Light of the World. *The Bible*

One: In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God. As Reformed Christians we accept the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments as, by the Holy Spirit, the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the Church universal and in our lives.

# All: Jesus Christ is the Word of God. *The Water*

One: The world was formed out of the chaos of the waters, Israel was saved through the waters of the Red Sea and came into their home through the Jordan River. Our entry into the family of God comes through the waters of baptism where we are washed clean and made whole.

# All: In Jesus Christ we are buried and raised from death through the waters of baptism.

#### The Bread

But sometimes, they didn't.

One: Sometimes they didn't.

Sometimes they didn't understand.

Sometimes they didn't want to understand.

Sometimes, because of fear, or anger, or want, or greed people stopped loving each other.

Stopped loving themselves.

Stopped loving you.

One: Or they forgot how important you were.
But you sent teachers, you sent prophets,
you sent grandmothers and grandfathers,
to tell the story of your love —
to shout the story of your love —
to sing the story of your love —
and call them back again.

One: You call us back to you again, especially in our acts of worship, in which remember your son's birth.

And so, with all of the voices of the heavens, with all of the creatures of the land, the sea and the air, together we shout:

All: Holy, holy Lord, God of Love and Life, the heavens and earth are full of your glory, Blessed is the One who comes in your Name!

One: You are Blessed, God most Holy! When the time was right, Jesus came to be among us. Born into this life, seeing your grace revealed in all things, he laughed with those who laughed, and cried with those who cried. Through your love, he healed the sick, he welcomed the outcast, he challenged those in power, and he called people back to your love. He calls us back to your love. As a tiny baby, as a teen, as an adult, in the presence of the Holy Spirit, Christ laughs and cries, heals and welcomes. challenges and loves, again and again and again.

One: We have been told that, on the night before he was taken to be tortured on the cross, Jesus sat with his disciples. Ate with them, in a feast of remembrance. They remembered God's act of salvation, bringing Israel's people out of slavery, into a new land of hope and wonder.
They told the story as it had been told for countless generations, and would be told far into the future — giving thanks to you, God of all love, for the bread and the cup. but most of all for the promise of your love.

One: At that meal, Jesus took the bread, asked your blessing upon it, broke it, and when he gave it to his disciples, he said: Take this — all of you — and eat it. This is me. My body. Given for you. Each time you eat it, remember me, until I come again.

One: Close to the meal's end,
he took the cup filled with wine,
asked your blessing upon it,
and when he gave it to his disciples, he said:
Take this — all of you — and drink it.
This is me. This is my promise in my life's blood —
poured out for you and for the world.
Each time you drink it, remember me,
until I come again.

One: So we, his disciples, eat and drink and remember. Let us say together what we believe:

# All: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

One: God, we ask your blessing on this bread and on this cup.

on this bread and on this cup.

We ask that your Holy Spirit would fill it and fill us, that we might truly be Christ's body in the world.

Fill our souls with your Presence, and join us with all the faithful of every time and place, that we might fill the world with you Love!

Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all is yours, God most holy, now and forever.
So we pray as Jesus taught:

#### THE LORD'S PRAYER

All: Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory, forever. Amen.
