Pentecost Offering

Today we collect the Pentecost Special Offering, as part of the PCUSA Presbyterian Mission. As you know, on Pentecost we celebrate the Holy Spirit descending upon the Apostles and leading 3000 persons to act on their faith and to be baptized and to follow Christ. This offering is designated to help bring young people to their own faith, allow avenues for them to meet and share stories, ideas and their gifts, and to help minister to children at risk in our communities.

Specifically, our congregation will keep 40% of the collection to "support local youth programs" about which it is passionate. The Presbyterian Mission Agency will receive 60% of the funds to support the Young Adult Volunteers program, Ministries with Youth program, and education and advocacy for children at risk through "Educate a Child: Transform the World" national initiative.
