### FROM OUR PASTOR:

On the eighth of November, Deb and I set out to South Park Mall in Charlotte for some shopping ... not Christmas shopping, mind you ... just shopping. I am amazed at the traffic that surrounded the shopping area as we arrive.

Is something special going on here today? I don't think so.

The crowd inside is as thick as the traffic out on the street. In the center of the mall, in the center of the masses of shoppers ... a Christmas tree ... an enormous, gigantic, colossal Christmas tree.

At the base of the tree sits the reason, at least one reason, for the multitudes that surround us as we walk the halls of shopping: Jolly Ol' St. Nick.

November eighth? Really? Where did Advent go?

Advent ... the time of expectation, of anticipation, of preparation, of longing for Christ's coming, Christ's arrival. Advent ... the time marked so well in the parable of the bridesmaids who are anxiously awaiting the coming of the Bridegroom (Matt 25:1-13). There is profound joy at the Bridegroom's expected coming. And yet, a warning of the need for preparation echoes through the parable.

Advent symbolizes the spiritual journey of each of us as individuals and as a congregation, as we affirm that Christ has come, that He is present in the world today, and that He will come again in a mighty way.

As God's people, we join with creation as it groans, "awaiting its redemption" (Romans 8:22).

It is this hope of redemption, however faint at times, which brings to the world the anticipation of a Christ who will reign with truth and justice and righteousness over the people and in all creation. It is that hope anticipated, and now anticipates anew, the Christ who will bring peace and justice and righteousness to the world.

As the world rushes head-on to Christmas, pause, breathe, take respite, savor this season of Advent. Allow the profound joy of the Bridegroom's expected coming to invade your heart; and yet, allow the warning of the need for preparation to echo through your very soul as well. This Advent, may we sing aloud with deep conviction:

*Come, O Come, Emmanuel,  
And ransom captive Israel!  
That mourns in lonely exile here  
Until the Son of God appear.  
Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel  
Shall come to thee, O Israel!*

### *Racial Ethnic schools and Colleges*

#### *Living the Christian Life*

Patricia Hsu Payan was born in Taiwan, lived her childhood in Brazil, and grew up a Buddhist. Today, she is a devoted Presbyterian and wants to thank people like you for making that possible.

"If I hadn't gone to Presbyterian Pan American School, I might not be Christian today," she says.

"Coming from a third-world country, we couldn't afford the school. It was very difficult for my parents to even send me to the US, let alone pay for school." She was able to attend Pan Am in the mid-'80s because of gifts to programs like the Christmas Joy Offering.

"While I was there, I received a scholarship," Payan says. "I knew that scholarship didn't just happen. Somebody had to give the money to the school in order for me to get the scholarship. It taught me how to give. Today, in the world, we're so busy with our lives and making money, but Pan Am taught me there is something more important."

Payan arrived at the school hoping only to learn English and prepare herself for college. She says a strict schedule and small, close-knit community setting helped her develop good study habits and a strong work ethic. But, it was a deeper lesson that meant the most.

"We had chapel every day; we had church on Sunday," she said. "Every morning after breakfast I would stop by our chapel and pray. I would sit there and reflect and talk to God. That was the foundation of what I do today—this is something I developed at Pan Am."

Payan graduated from Pan Am in 1986. She went on to college at the University of Texas, where she received her Master's in Business Administration. She is now the owner and president of Physicians Management Services. And she still believes in giving as others gave to her—serving on the Mission Committee for Forest Hills Presbyterian Church in Helotes, Texas.

"I'm growing closer to God as I move along," she said. "Now, I'm so very grateful for being able to go

to the school. Presbyterians who contribute should know that, no matter how big or small the donation, they are doing something good. It's not just an opportunity for education, but an opportunity to expose a child to the Christian faith who might not otherwise have that. To learn about the Christian faith—to me, that's the most important part."

#### *Board of Pensions*

##### *Serving Those Who Have Served*

Reverend Thomas "Thom" Beech, now retired, says the Board of Pensions saved his life.

"Without their help, I'd be out on the street."

Rev. Beech spent a lifetime in service to others. For him, it was a calling he never expected.

"I was already out of high school and working in the service industry when a man stopped in from my church," he says. "I asked the guy why he was going into ministry. He told me about all the social ministry and good he would do with his life, and a voice in my head said 'Why not you?'"

After attending Westminster Seminary in Pennsylvania, Rev. Beech began his ministry in North Dakota. He and his wife could not have children, and they eventually adopted four Native American children in need. Rev. Beech credits his children for what began years of ministry with Native Americans.

"I served with Apaches in New Mexico and later Navajos in Arizona, among others," he says. "I also worked in West Virginia doing 'tentmaking.' I've always had small churches and farm churches."

But in 2003, after a lifetime of service, he found himself alone in Florida struggling to get by while caring for his wife, who suffered from Alzheimer's disease.

Then, someone from Westminster Manor in Bradenton, Florida, contacted him asking why he was the only retired Presbyterian minister in the area not a part of their community, run by Presbyterians. When he explained he could not afford it, the group contacted the Board of Pensions, which offered Rev. Beech help through the Income Supplement and Housing Supplement program, supported, in part, by your gifts to the Christmas Joy Offering. It made a difference, perhaps just when it counted the most. Rev. Beech lost his wife just a year after moving into Westminster, but he was not alone.

"I have hundreds of close friends now. Everybody here cares," he said. "It might not be as fancy or as new as some other places, but it's really nice, and the friendly people here make all the difference."
