THE MINISTRY OF OUR CHILDCARE CENTER

AN UPDATE

Dear Friends in Christ,

At the December session meeting, the elders addressed the future of the Presbyterian Childcare Center, which has been a ministry of the church for over 50 years in one form or another. The discussion was far ranging, from current financial figures to the deep conviction that Laurinburg Presbyterian has a mission to aid the children of our community.

The ultimate session decision is that we will continue to support the center during the foreseeable future, taking steps to correct financial shortfalls and increase enrollment while maintaining the intimate and caring environment for the infants, toddlers and preschoolers who attend. I want to share with you some of the details of that decision, aware that in doing so I must balance the risk of "airing dirty laundry in public" against the risk of letting rumors and gossip be the only source of information you may receive.

1. The childcare center is losing money. By the end of December, five out of the last six quarters will have operated in the red. Some of those losses were minor, and easily covered by reserves, but some were major. Staffing levels have remained even, but enrollment has steadily decreased. This trend has seriously jeopardized the center's bank balance and must be reversed.
2. The session expressed the belief that it is possible to build enrollment over the next months and return stability to the program. By trimming staff, enrolling in programs like N.C. Pre-K, enhancing the classrooms and buildings where the children gather, and increasing publicity in the community, the center can attract new families and reassure

parents of current enrollees. The session believes that the unique, loving personality of Presbyterian Childcare is worth maintaining.

3. To assist in this time of rebuilding, the session will temporarily erase the rent that the center pays for utilities and custodial care, and will provide money for the center's ongoing expenses. This is not an open-ended promise of funding. The church is not prepared at this point to continually subsidize the center, but wishes to give at least 9 months to turn things around. (These funds will come from income gained in 2017 on the generous bequest of the McKay sisters.)
4. The elders are aware that the childcare situation in Laurinburg has changed since 11 years ago when the church last loaned money to the center. More alternatives for preschool and nursery care now exist, there are fewer children of preschool age in our church and the community, and public schools and government programs now compete with private childcare. In the next 9 months we will assess how to meet these challenges.
5. The session believes our church can and should assist and encourage the children and youth of Laurinburg. Exactly how we can best do that is a matter of debate. We hope to involve our members personally in the resurgence of the childcare center as a significant means to that end. However, if after a generous time for renewal the childcare center is unable to reverse its fortunes, we will withdraw our financial support. Should that unpleasant outcome arise, the congregation and community can be assured of two things: we will provide staff and parents of our children adequate notice so they can smoothly transition to new arrange-

ments, and we will find an alternative project through which our church can support the children and youth of our community toward a bright future.

Let us unite around this decision to give our child-care center time to right the ship and prosper. Please share this information with confidence and hope, trusting that God will use us to care for the children of our community.

Christian Ed Corner: Epiphanies

Growing up in a half-Puerto Rican household, Epiphany was a big deal. The Christmas decorations in our household stayed up until January 6, and that morning always brought us a few small gifts from "the Three Kings." Memorable standouts from my childhood include a new plastic snow saucer and a label maker. Calendars were also common gifts from the kings (and I'm pretty sure my mom waited until January 4 or 5 to buy them on sale).

I didn't really think much about the other meaning of the word "epiphany" until I was in college, when I attended a worship music workshop with composer Michael Burkhardt. The program took place in early January, so he talked about Epiphany, but urged us to think of other moments of epiphany throughout the Gospels, the moments when people realized exactly who Jesus was or the full depths of God's love. It didn't always come as a big moment, with a shining star and fantastic gifts. For Peter the epiphany emerged out of a simple conversation, when Jesus asked him "Who do you say that I am?," and he responded with the truth.

I had a little epiphany moment just this morning (December 18) when a picture from last year popped up on my Facebook feed. Nine kids in the children's choir, posing in the chancel in their nativity costumes. I looked at the picture and realized that of the nine, six have aged out or stopped coming. A lot has changed in one year, and lately I've been worrying a lot about the future.

But somehow we still had nine there yesterday, only three of whom were in the picture a year ago. And those nine young kids, who obviously aren't as musically sophisticated as the middle schoolers who have moved on from children's choir, come every week excited to participate. They get along with each other, try their best, and are clearly learning what we try to teach them based on their answers during the children's message. Working with them is still often the highlight of my week.

So I guess my epiphany is that we're doing pretty well. My hope for the new year is that we can find the light and joy in the small, imperfect things we do every day, rather than pining for a time when things were bigger or seemed like more of an event
