January 6th Epiphany Yesterday and Today

January 6 is celebrated as Epiphany. In some cultures it is known as Three Kings' Day. Epiphany brings the Advent/Christmas Season and the Twelve Days of Christmas (usually counted from the evening of December 25th until the morning of January 6th, which is the Twelfth Day) to a close.

The term epiphany means "to show" or "to make known" or even "to reveal." Epiphany remembers the coming of the Wise Men bringing gifts to visit the Christ child, who "revealed" Jesus to the world as Lord and King.

The Wise Men or Magi were the first Gentiles to acknowledge Jesus as "King" and so were the first to show Jesus to a wider world as the incarnate Christ. This act of worship by the Magi was one of the first indications that Jesus came for all people, of all nations, of all races, and that the work of God in the world would not be limited to only a few.

Today Epiphany is observed as a time of focusing on the mission of the church in reaching others by "showing" Jesus as the Savior of all people. It is also a time of focusing on Christian community and fellowship, especially in healing the divisions of prejudice and bigotry that we all too often create between God's children.

An Epiphany Prayer

"Gracious God, we thank you for revealing yourself to us in Jesus the Christ, we who once were not your people but whom you chose to adopt as your people. As ancient Israel confessed long ago, we realize that it was not because of our own righteousness, or our own superior wisdom, or strength, or power, or numbers. It was simply because you loved us, and chose to show us that love in Jesus.

As you have accepted us when we did not deserve your love, will you help us to accept those whom we find it hard to love? Forgive us, O Lord, for any attitude that we harbor that on any level sees ourselves as better or more righteous than others. Will you help us to remove the barriers of prejudice and to tear down the walls of bigotry, religious or social? O Lord, help us realize that the walls that we erect for others only form our own prisons.


Will you fill us so full of your love that there is no more room for intolerance. As you have forgiven us much, will you enable us with your strength to forgive others even more? Will you enable us through your abiding presence among us, communally and individually, to live our lives in a manner worthy of the name we bear?

May we, through your guidance and our faithful obedience, find new avenues in ways that we have not imagined of holding the Light of your love so that it may be a Light of revelation for all people.

We thank you for your love, praise you for your gift, ask for your continued presence with us, and bring these petitions in the name of your Son, who has truly revealed your heart. Amen."

From the Finance & Administration
Committee:

“Nontaxable IRA Transfers to Eligible Charities Made Permanent Taxpayers who are 70 1/2 or older could, in tax years beginning before January 1, 2015, make tax-free distributions to a charity from an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) of up to \$100,000 per year. These distributions weren’t subject to the charitable contribution percentage limits since they were neither included in gross income nor claimed as a deduction on the taxpayer’s return. Under pre-Act law, these rules didn’t apply to distributions made in tax years beginning after December 31, 2014. New law, effective for distributions made in tax years beginning after December 31, 2014, the Act retroactively revives and permanently extends the ability of individuals at least 70 1/2 years of age to exclude from gross income qualified charitable distributions from IRAs up to \$100,000 per year. (Code Sec. 408(d)(8)(F), as amended by Act Sec. 112)”

Check with your tax preparer to see if you may qualify for this distribution from your IRA to a charity.
