### GATHERING UP/STEPPING AHEAD

FEBRUARY 12 CONGREGATION MISSION STUDY EVENT

Friends in Christ,

This letter is one more attempt to publicize the February 12 event that will guide the Mission Study team with the final stage of its work. I hope you are planning to attend this "Gathering Up, Stepping Ahead" event.

Please remember why we are conducting this Mission Study. God calls a church, the earthly body of Christ, to listen for and carry out his will. We can do that effectively or ineffectively. A church operates best if it knows who its members are, what reaches them spiritually, what is the neighborhood and world context of its ministry, and what God asks us to do in those circumstances. That is why over recent months we've sponsored Bible studies, encouraged you to fill out a questionnaire, and polled community leaders and neighbors for their opinions. It has been 12 years since the congregation called the previous pastor, and that was the last time you conducted an evaluation of your ministry and its future. Much has changed in both the church and the culture since then. It is crucial that we take this new look.

Specifically, we expect two outcomes from the process:

- We are drafting a plan for our future. The writing group of the Mission Study team will produce a document. It will include the results of our work thus far and what we decide on the 12th. It will combine that with a brief history of our church, demographic information and descriptions of our buildings and the community. We will present this document to you at a congregational meeting, answer any final questions and then ask you to endorse, by a vote, this plan. This Mission Study represents what our congregation believes. The vote commits us to implementing its actions. It is our "marching orders"; our agenda for the next 10 years or

so. Remember our earlier slogan:

4 Months  10 Years.

- We are describing ourselves for our next pastor. The Pastor Nominating Committee will be elected soon. That PNC will use the document, crystallizing its findings into a shorter form and distributing that to all candidates who have expressed interest in the pastor position here. In fact, the priorities we have determined will guide the PNC in choosing the right person to help us implement what we believe God is calling us to accomplish. Copies of the whole Mission Study will be available to any candidate the PNC is considering in the last stages of the search.

On Sunday, Feb 12, here is what you can expect.

- We will worship together at 11 as usual but the worship will be slightly shorter. In the sermon I will highlight a few of the results of the congregational inventory that are useful for the church but aren't immediately related to our work later that day. We will leave the sanctuary with the final hymn, processing to the fellowship hall.
- We will eat a light lunch and begin our meeting. After lunch, children under 11 will be provided with childcare. If you will need childcare, please contact the church office so we can be sure to have adequate staff.
- As lunch is finishing, I will remind you why we are gathered today. Our team will then present a PowerPoint summary of the findings from the Bible studies, the questionnaire, the community surveys, and areas of concern and concentration identified in all that information.

- Different table groups will then consider one of the key areas of concern and concentration. Each group develops a "mission plan" with 3-5 steps the church could take to address the issue raised. The steps can be suggested activities and programs or changes of attitude and personal priorities. Briefly, the groups then evaluate their mission plans, listing obstacles and difficulties that may hinder the accomplishment of those plans and ways to address the obstacles. These "mission plans" will be presented to the assembled group for brief comment.
- Table groups will then review options for a short vision statement for the church, taking into account the information earlier presented, personal responses to the 5 Questions, and your own sense of our church's identity and calling. Remember, as it says in scripture: "Without vision, the people perish." Before leaving on Sunday, we will vote on the best vision statement for our church.
- The day will end, we hope, before 3 pm, with a summary statement and promise of a final document for you to endorse. We will ask for volunteers who might like to work on a visual symbol that represents our church and its ministry plan.

Thank you for reading this long letter. I hope it has both answered questions and sparked interest. We truly want this event to represent the spectrum of your ideas and hopes. We have gathered up our information. Now let us step ahead with specific visions and plans for action. That is what we will tackle on February 12.

### **Christian Ed Corner**

The resources and ideas that have caught my attention this month are more for adults than kids; I hope you don't mind if I meander slightly off topic. Like many of you, I greatly appreciated reading Dietrich Bonhoeffer's meditations during Advent. And a few weeks ago, I encountered Bonhoeffer in another document—the University of Virginia Arts & Sciences Magazine, in an article about Virginia's Project on Lived Theology. Among other things, the article mentioned a lecture that Professor Charles Marsh, project director, had given on Bonhoeffer's 1930-31 visit to the United States.

While on a teaching fellowship at the Union Theological Seminary in New York, Bonhoeffer encountered a variety of American religious, political, and cultural organizations. He was fascinated by African American worship music, and undertook a trip South to visit more black churches. Bonhoeffer saw American segregation first-hand at the same time forces in Germany were making plans that would lead to an equally drastic expression of racism.

One of the Project on Lived Theology's many resources is a digital archive exploring the intersections between faith and the American Civil Rights Movement. The leaders have also written and edited

numerous books and host workshops—take a look if you are interested in seeing the ways that teachers and scholars from across the country and across denominations are looking to put faith into action: <http://www.livedtheology.org/>.

The intersection between Bonhoeffer—who we tend to think of in the context of Nazi Germany—and the Jim Crow system of American segregation seemed particularly fortuitous to me, since it connected two things I'm working on for the month of February. The first is a very special joint anthem that the Chancel Choir and Joyful Singers will share in worship on February 12, based on a text found in Cologne after World War II. The second is Civil Rights Movement Songs & Stories, a concert that José and I are coordinating in UNCP's Givens Performing Arts Center on February 28 at 7 pm. Both employ music to help us think about how we put our beliefs into practice, and I hope many of you will join us.

In Cologne, at the end of the Second World War, the following text was found scribbled onto the wall of a basement that had sheltered several Jewish families:

I believe in the sun even when it is not shining.  
I believe in love even when no one is there.  
I believe in God even when He is silent.

Join us for worship on Sunday, February 12, when the Chancel Choir and Joyful Singers will combine forces to sing an anthem on this text.
