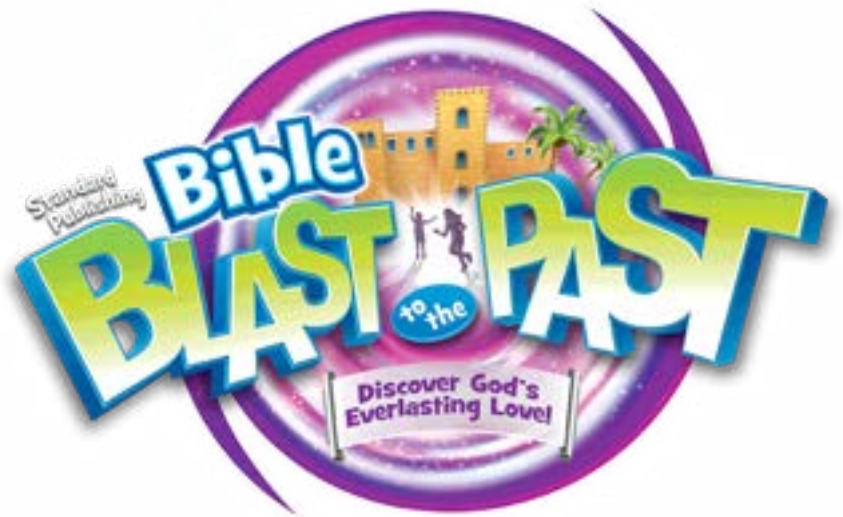

## From Our Pastor

It is 2:00 am; I'm about to walk out the door to see 24 of our youth and youth leaders off for their Puerto Rico trip. I'm going to pray for them before they go. That is such a small thing to do. While I'm waiting, I have to write this article for the *Messenger*. To be honest, I do not have any great insights.

To find some inspiration, I watch ESPN's Sports Center (okay, not as inspiring as desperate). I'm bombarded with video clips of the Golden State Warriors as they win their first NBA title in 40 years. While that is odd enough, they did it with a strategy that seldom works in the NBA—small ball: a small lineup of players who hustle on defense, play together, and shoot a lot of shots beyond the 3-point line. This gunslinger mentality works infrequently. But this year—small ball takes the day (and the trophy).

A few nights earlier! I catch a few minutes of *The Hobbit* (A movie based on one of my favorite books ever). I watch enough to see/hear one of my favorite quotes from Gandalf the Gray: *"Saruman believes it is only great power that can hold evil in check, but that is not what I have found. I found it is the small everyday deeds of ordinary folk that keep the darkness at bay... small acts of kindness and love."*

This moment comes after I have used Mark 4 for the sermon text: *"Jesus also said, "With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable will we use for it? It is like a mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade."*

That follows a week around the church where people have done many small things: fill in around the office, count the offerings from the Sunday worship service, give/collect/deliver food to Church Community Service, buy a pair of shoes for a student in Scotland County Schools, visit members in the hospital, give time to oversee the capital campaign projects, drive the mission team to the airport and back at 3:00 am, make/serve the bereavement meal for the Rhue family, attend Dooda Robertson's graveside funeral in the heat of the day, take meals to home-bound folks ... et cetera.

In a part of our session meeting discussion (in the same week), we discussed the importance of our

Wednesday evening fellowship/meal/worship—basically one hour and fifteen minutes of your week. What energizes me about this conversation is the energy of the session to spend the money for this ministry; moreover, it is the nature of the conversation that is most encouraging. Session members speak of this ministry as an outreach of fellowship for members of our congregation to eat together, and as an opportunity to invite others who might not have much family with whom to gather for a meal.

That is not a groundbreaking idea—rather, it is really a small thing when you think about it. But, that is the kingdom of God: yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs. So often we overlook the kingdom of God in the small aspects around us (and within us).

My phone alarm is ringing so I won't forget to go. I can't imagine that my 2:00 am send-off prayer can possibly be profound. It's really just a small act when you think about it.

The rains came so we can finally relax about having to water everyday! With that in mind, I wanted to thank Debra Pierce for taking over the drip system this year. She has been doing a great job and our plants are doing great because of her help. So, please do not bother the control box for this system! Debra has it under control. Debra is out most mornings around 9-10AM or she can be reached at 910-280-5675 if you have any questions.

If you have a drip line that is not getting water, it may not be connected right so let Debra know. Also, if you have a line that is leaking bad, you can replace it with another line beside the building.

Also wanted to update everyone on the bees. This year our hive lost their queen and this made the bees very uneasy. They stung several gardeners and even a gardener's dog. They chased me so bad on the mower that I had to borrow a beekeeper suit to wear while cutting grass and tilling a few plots. This was not very fun in the 90 degree temperatures! So now the hive is gone and we are getting another hive any day that will be placed across the road.

I have to brag on our plots this year. We have the best plots of our 8 yrs of doing this. Please take some pictures to share with your families and friends on FB, etc. so we can show others what they are missing. Maybe this will entice more to join us next year.

We are very fortunate to have some dedicated and caring gardeners that have taken the un-leased plots and planted tons of things for giveaway.
