The past two years have been a blessing to serve this congregation. Here, I have had the wonderful opportunity to work with your children, youth, college students and adults. Since this was my home church, it has always felt like home. You all have always encouraged me, supported me and allowed me to try new things. During my time at LPC, I feel like I have developed a pastoral identity and strengthened my gifts and skills for ministry. You all have opened your homes and your hearts to me. I also hope, that this congregation will continue to make a concentrated effort in supporting the work at Monroe by continuing with a future Fellowship/CNE Event we were planning in August/September, for the continued support of the scouts doing projects at Monroe, and for continuing to send North Laurinburg students and our own children to Monroe for Summer Camp so that these children may have powerful faith experiences.

As you all know, in May, I would normally start focusing my time at Monroe as we prepare for the summer. It will be my intentions to continue to do so to ensure a fantastic summer camp program. The first week of May I had planned to attend the ARW Conference at Montreat. Even with leaving, it has been encouraged, by the Board, that I continue to plan to do so, for which I'm grateful. My last official day is planned for Tuesday, May 24, 2016.

Once again, I can't thank this session and congregation enough for your continued support throughout these past two years. To quote Paul, “I will thank God every time I remember you.”

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN REPORT

This report comes as we end the first year of our three year "Building our Faith" Capital Campaign to address major needs of our church. The buses have been purchased and the roof replacement has been completed. We had hoped to remodel the bathrooms in the Fellowship Hall; however, our pledges fell short and this has been put on hold.

The total cost of our improvements was \$390,104. Due to the initial support of the congregation, we only needed to borrow \$220,000 and, as of to date, we have a loan balance of \$210,000. We project interest at \$10,000 and adding a contingency of \$2,000 will leave a total loan balance of \$222,000. The pledges due for the next two years come to \$162,028. Added to this we have from Capital Funds and Endowment Funds \$63,283, giving us a projected income of \$224,311.

Thanks to our congregation and their generous giving, we are right on target to meet our goal. It is most important that we continue to meet our pledges over the next two years as this will enable us to keep our interest costs as projected.

Pentecost Offering

On May 15, 2016, Pentecost Sunday, our congregation will participate in the Pentecost Special Offering, as part of the PCUSA Presbyterian Mission. Young people in the church and the world are the beneficiaries of this offering.

As you know, on Pentecost we celebrate the Holy Spirit descending upon the Apostles and leading 3000 persons to act on their faith and to be baptized and to follow Christ. This offering is designated to help bring young people to their own faith, allow avenues for them to meet and share stories, ideas and their gifts, and to help minister to children at risk in our communities. Specifically, our congregation will keep 40% of the collection to "support local youth programs" about which it is passionate. The Presbyterian Mission Agency will receive 60% of the funds to support the Young Adult Volunteers program, Ministries with Youth program, and education and advocacy for children at risk through "Educate a Child: Transform the World" national initiative. North Carolina native and world-known composer, Joseph M. Martin, will conduct a choral workshop at First Baptist Church on Sunday, June 5 at 4:00 pm for various community choirs. Some of Laurinburg Presbyterian's choir members will participate. The community choirs and Martin will perform a concert at 7 pm in the sanctuary of First Baptist Church following the workshop on June 5.

Martin earned his Bachelor of Music degree from Furman University in Greenville, SC and Master of Music degree in Piano Performance at the University of Texas in Austin. A prolific composer of more than 1,200 anthems and 52 cantatas, he is a member of the staff of Hal Leonard publications and the editor of sacred publications at Shawnee Press. Over ten million copies of his compositions have been sold worldwide.

His sacred concerts are like no other church concert you have ever attended. Touched by his flying fingers, the hymns and folk songs he plays are transformed into a rainbow of colorful sounds. His repertoire ranges from American hymnody to soaring Celtic tunes, from impressionistic adaptations of sacred standards to rollicking gospel toe-tappers.
