Lee Hinson-Hasty is coordinator for Theological Education and Seminary Relations and a lead staff person for the Committee on Theological Education of the Presbyterian Church (USA) and the Presbyterian Mission Agency, Ordained in 1995, he has served as a campus minister and pastor in Virginia and as director of church relations at St. Andrews Presbyterian College in North Carolina (2001-2004). Hinson-Hasty actively engages in dialogue, study and initiatives that foster relationships and leadership development in the church and academy including on his the blog, "A More Expansive View: Encounters with Presbyterians and our Seminaries." A graduate of Wake Forest University (BA-History), Louisville Seminary (MDiv), and McCormick Theological Seminary (DMin), Hinson-Hasty is interested in leadership in a multicultural world, serves as Chair of the Forum for Theological Exploration (formerly the Fund for Theological Education), is a member of Lectio Jubilate, and is married to the Rev. Dr. Elizabeth Hinson-Hasty. Elizabeth and Lee are parents of Garrison (14), Emme (8), and a year-old Cavalier King Charles Spaniel, Basci (Ba-chee).

#### FROM OUR PASTOR:

This time of year we begin to think of the notion of Stewardship. Actually, as Christians, we should think of Stewardship each day. Stewardship is about being grateful, and responsible stewards of the gifts we receive from God. The tradition of giving back to God and to the church comes from the Biblical practice of tithing, giving back a tenth of our earnings to God (Numbers 18:26).

In reading about Stewardship on the PCUSA.org website, I noticed a curious statistic about Presbyterians. Those who have the least tend to give the most. Percentage-wise more people with incomes of less than \$25,000 tithe (give 10) percent) than those with a greater income. The same is true of the way they give their time and talents to the church.

The <u>PCUSA.org</u> website notes that on average Presbyterians give 1.5 percent of their annual income to the church—an average of about \$580 annually, which results in a total amount of \$1.5 billion. If every Presbyterian tithed, together we would give \$9.5 billion.

One basic reason most churches struggle with the idea of stewardship is that they think stewardship is only fund-raising. It is how you pay for the church's budget. Stewardship is what many churches do only one Sunday a year, usually in November (sound familiar?). When church leaders and pastors (including me) make stewardship a taboo subject, poor stewardship results.

Stewardship is not only contributing money to the church; it's also about contributing time and talents, and volunteering for ministry and mission. It's about reaching out to build relationships from a perspective of abundance instead of scarcity. Out of God's abundance, we give to support with our very lives what God is doing in our midst.

Stewardship is living out our lives with the belief that all we are and have is God's, entrusted with us to share. Stewardship includes vocational discernment. It includes care of creation. It includes spiritual formation of our children and young people.

Yes, part of stewardship is fundraising. But the starting point for the stewardship conversation is that we, the church, recognize that we need to share what God has given us. The starting point for stewardship is not the need and mission of the institution. The starting point for stewardship is not our mood, or our likes or dislikes. As people of faith, we are about generosity, as Christ was about generosity. We are about encouraging people to live with their money in a way that is rooted in our faith, and our understanding of God's abundance.

If we believe that the mission of the church is to "make disciples," we also believe that exciting things happen when we put a new emphasis on stewardship in its fullest dimension: our time, talent and treasures (financial resources).

Giving has always been a mark of Christian commitment and discipleship. The ways in which a believer uses God's gifts of material goods, personal abilities, and time should reflect a faithful response to God's self-giving in Jesus Christ and Christ's call to minister to and share with others in the world.

As a vibrant, exciting church, with many ministries going on in our community, may we make stewardship a spiritual matter this year. May stewardship be the way we live our daily commitment to Jesus Christ as our Lord. If we do, I think we will take care of the financial aspects of stewardship.
