From the Pastor:

This past spring I **STAND** on the stage in the fellowship hall to watch as the Taste of the Town takes place to help the Literacy Council in our community.

This summer I **SAT** in the Anderson auditorium at Montreat with about thirty folks from our youth group.

This summer I **STAND** out in the community garden and visit with people in the community who come to garden their plot.

This fall I **SAT** on a new bus as I rode to the beach with the MACS group to enjoy fellowship and ice cream.

I **WALK** up the hall of the church and visit with smiling, laughing, playing, learning children in the childcare.

I **TAKE** a pair of new Nike tennis shoes to a school for a seventh grade student to wear because he has no shoes that fit.

I **STAND** and look out my office window as Scouts walk into the hut across the street for their weekly meeting.

I **DO** all these things, and many others, because of your generous stewardship.

The notion of Stewardship is an ethic that expresses the responsible planning and management of resources. The concepts of stewardship can be applied to the environment and nature, economics, health, property, information, and theology.

In a less formal way—Stewardship is how we use our God-given gifts. Stewardship is how we use our talents, our time, and our financial resources. Stewardship is the way we use all our resources to carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world.

DID You KNOW?

- Over \$335.17 billion was given to charities in 2013 (up 4% from 2012).
- Of this, more money is given to religious causes

than to any other sector. Religious giving, however, was flat in 2013.

- Moreover, in the last 45 years, religion's share of the philanthropic pie has declined from 51% to 32%.
- Charitable giving has doubled in the past 25 years, but the number of nonprofits has tripled.

We may not be rich, but I think we have more than enough if we dare to dream and grow in faith. May we look beyond ourselves this year, focus on the community beyond us, and partner with one another and grow our vision of faith to see all that we do, and all the more we can do.

May we be faithful in a joyous way this year as we use all our resources to carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world.
