PENTECOST – SUNDAY, MAY 20

On Sunday, May 20, we will celebrate Pentecost.

Observed around the globe, Pentecost is the holy day where we commemorate the coming of the Spirit on the early followers of Jesus. Before the events of the first Pentecost, which came a few weeks after Jesus' death, there were followers of Jesus, but no movement that could be meaningfully called "the Church." From an historical perspective, Pentecost is the day on which the church was birthed and brought into being. Thus, Pentecost is nothing less than the Church's birthing day!

2018 PENTECOST OFFERING



The Pentecost Offering will be collected next Sundays, May 20, the day of Pentecost. This denominational offering provides a direct way to meet the needs of children at risk, youth, and young adults. Congregations are encouraged to keep 40 percent of the Offering to support ministries benefiting these age groups in their communities.

The General Assembly's portion (60 percent) provides leadership development opportunities for Presbyterian youth and young adults and supports children-at-risk programs at the national level. Since 1998, Presbyterians of all ages have raised more than \$8 million for these ministries that benefit younger members of God's family.
