

Something Old Something New! New Adult Education Programming Announced by Christian Nurture and Education Committee

In addition to the ongoing "Fun Adults Class" and the "Men's Bible Study Class", held at their regular Sunday morning 9:45 AM times, the CN&E Committee is inaugurating several new adult faith formation programs beginning in October.

The newest feature will be an after-worship, in-depth adult educational event entitled, "Stay and Grow". A light lunch will be served at Noon followed by the event/class which will conclude by 1:30 PM. The topics will vary from Bible, theology, ethics, spiritual discernment. A descriptive list is found below. Childcare will be provided if requested in advance through the church office.

The "Stay and Grow" events will be scheduled 2 to 3 times per month in October and November

The October "Stay and Grow" lunch series will be an introduction to the Old Testament led by Rev. Roderic Frohman, titled:

From Legend to History: An Introduction to the Myth, Metaphor and Message of the Old Testament.

The November series will be: Islam 101: An Introduction to the Basic Tenants of Islam.

The presenter will be Dr. Charles (Skip) Clark. At St. Andrew's University Skip was a Professor of History, and Chair of the Division of Social and Behavioral Sciences. At the University of West Georgia Skip was the Chair of the History Department and then Dean of the Graduate School. At Augusta University, he was Dean of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences, and Professor of History. He has taught Medieval and Early Modern European History, the History of Science, and Modern Middle Eastern History. Skip is a member of St. David's Episcopal Church.
