- **Souper Bowl of Caring February 9**th The Souper Bowl of Caring began in 1990 with a simple prayer said by Reverend Brad Smith at Spring Valley Presbyterian Church in

Columbia, South Carolina. "Lord, even as we enjoy the Super Bowl football game, help us be mindful of those who are without a bowl of soup to eat." That year 22 churches raised \$5,700 for local food banks. More than \$163 million in monetary and food donations have been raised with this campaign. All donations stay in the local area.
